

SUBJECT: NEBRASKA VOTERS OVERHELMINGLY SUPPORT HEARTBEAT BILL

A recent survey of registered voters conducted by WPA Intelligence on behalf of the Susan B. Anthony Pro-Life America organization found that Nebraskans support protecting the lives of unborn children who have a beating heart - whether they are pro-life or pro-choice, including half of Independents.


Nebraskans support protecting a baby with a beating heart




- A majority of Nebraskans support a bill outlawing abortions once a heartbeat is detected or in the case of rape, incest, or to save the mother's life.
- Including nearly two-thirds of Independents, over half of young women, and nearly half of Democrats.

Nebraskans prefer a heartbeat bill and reject extreme policies

Nearly two-thirds of voters prefer a heartbeat bill that allows for exceptions for rape, incent, or to save the mother's life over the extreme position of allowing abortion without restriction.




Nebraskans are more likely to support a heartbeat bill after learning about the science



Abortion advocates don't want to talk about the science behind heartbeats because the more voters know about the life of unborn children, the more they support protections against abortions.



Nebraskans strongly reject allowing abortion until the moment of birth



- Only 21% of Nebraskans support Planned Parenthood's extreme policy of abortions without restrictions.
- This extreme policy is supported by only 16% of Independents, less than a third of women, and less than half of Democrats

Methodology

WPA Intelligence conducted a study of registered voters in Nebraska.

WPA selected a stratified sample of registered voters from the Nebraska voter file using Registration Based Sampling (RBS). The sample was stratified based on geography, age, gender, ethnicity, party, geography, and cells. This methodology allows us to avoid post-survey "weighting" which can reduce the reliability of survey results.

Respondents were contacted by phone via a live operator December 18-20, 2022. The study has a sample size of n=528 registered voters and a margin of $\pm 4.3\%$.
